


Adventures With Bruce: A Thirty Day Hike Along Canada's Oldest and Longest Footpath

This is a journal about walking the whole

Bruce Trail in 30 days in the summer of 2010. While author Steve Hainsworth found a comfortable indoor bed for most of those nights, he did walk the whole trail in close to 30 days straight, making for about 30 km a day. You have to be fit to keep up that pace, especially on the rough and rugged parts of the Trail. Armchair hiking at its best, this self-published book is a fun, entertaining account by a friendly hiker. Plenty of photographs add to the you-are-there sensation of being with Hainsworth on his journey.

the findings of studies of ancient human burials from the world. Current technologies reveal amazing details of how people lived, died and were honoured or desecrated by survivors. The famous, such as Tutankhamen, Queen Hatshepsut and Amenhotep of Egypt and The Iceman of the Alps are presented along with the unknown, such as child sacrifices from the high Andes and Europeans found along Asia's Silk Road. Some bodies have been so well preserved that skin, hair and clothing have remained in excellent condition, making ancient deaths look recent. An utterly fascinating book.


