Shared Bikes to Remain in "The Hammer"

ccording to CBC News, the City of Hamilton intends to contribute more than \$300,000 per year to Hamilton Bike Share, a not-for-profit program that provides around 800 bicycles for city use. Cyclists pay to pick up a bike from one hub and can return it to any other hub. There are hubs from Ottawa St. to Dundas. Bikes can also be rented by visitors to the city on an hourly plan without longterm commitment. The taxpayer funds should help to stabilize the program and let it become permanent.
